DFA Final Report and The Way Forward

It was with great confidence that we appeared before our 4th DFA hearing on the 4th of March. Confidence? Yes, we had now crossed all the T's and dotted all the I's. The actual granting of the rights took less than 20 minutes, this after 3 years of planning and hard work. You can just imagine the emotion once it was all over. We had a huge celebration with about 40 people, which included the Mayor of Maruleng, the Speaker of the House, the Chairman and members of the Community Property Association (Claimants), the Town Planner, the Technical Manager, Tribunal members, Consultants and a few close friends. Zandspruit received good local media coverage of the above events.

The next day though, it was back to work as now we believe the real work starts. The Electrical and Civil engineers have been appointed and are soon to start with the final designs of the infrastructure.

Quotes have been requested from Land Surveyors to peg out the entire phase 1 (Bush & Aero Estate and retail sites) and the team at Origin Town Planners have already secured the "rooi nommers".

These are numbers that are allocated by the Surveyor General's office to Hoedspruit extension 12 (as the Bush & Aero Estate will be officially named). We also have the numbers for Hoedspruit ext 10, which are all the town stands. These numbers have been placed on our final approved Site Development Plan (SDP) and will be known as Revision Z – Z for Zandspruit! We have also appointed a professional model maker that will make a 1:2500 full colour, contoured model of the entire farm. This will assist the sales team in explaining all the different sections of the complete Zandspruit development and give a clear picture

the layout.

Our time frame for the installation of services in Phase 1 is aimed at the third quarter of this year, with transfers being possible shortly thereafter in the last quarter of this year. For those of you keen to start building, this will be possible from about the middle of the year, so start getting those plans drawn!

Farm Management

Rainfall

We have 3 rain gauges on the property; each recorded in excess of 800 mm during the period October 2008 - March 2009. More than double recorded this time last year.

Vegetation

Due to the amount of rain the bush has recovered considerably. Where there was initially just sandy soil, there is now almost impenetrable bush, making the finding of estate sights, more difficult.

There has been an increase in flower species as well as pioneer grasses and herbs. This is of great assistance in the recovery of eroded areas and the environment as a whole.

The eradication of various alien



plants has been an ongoing concern. With the help of Southern Cross Schools College Students, we have been able to remove large numbers of prickly pear and sisal plants. This has been tackled as an ongoing school project.

Animals

A pack of 9 Wild dogs have been sighted on Zandspruit several times in the last couple of months. They have been moving between Welverdiend, Raptors View and Zandspruit.

The general health of all animals has improved considerably.

Babies of most animal species



have been sighted, excluding giraffe and waterbuck.

As we did last year, we will be controlling the increased animal numbers through game capture and culling.



Sandspruit River & Dams

The Sandspruit River has been flowing for the last 3 months. This has changed the look of the river with big sandbanks where there used to be holes due to excavation projects under previous ownership.

During this season we have been involved in stocking the dams and river with indigenous tilapia/bream. This has attracted a wide variety of fish eating birds, such as Pied and Giant Kingfishers, Cormorants and Herons. With the river flowing, different species of fish are abundant in all deep pools throughout the river. Good sightings of Fish Eagles are becoming

more common.

Road and Erosion Control

Most roads have survived this year's rainfall. Minor work will be completed as soon as the roads dry up. All river crossing were badly damaged and have been repaired for 4x4 vehicle crossings only.

These will be repaired properly when the river stops flowing.

The main crossing to the island will be worked on later in the year due to the amount of water currently present at the crossing. We can still cross onto the island on the fence line road.

Spillways from the dams were put under a lot of pressure during the heavy rains. Repairs to these will happen once the rainy season is over.

Things of interest

The Bush Camp has become home to a large number of Impala and Wildebeest, who are enjoying the short grass around the camp.

A good sighting of a 2.5 m Python was seen at the Lodge sight last month.

A very rare Grey Hooded King Fisher has been seen on a number of occasions on the road to the Bush Camp.

Hyena activity seems to be on the increase. Hyena calls can be heard most nights and their middens have been seen at a couple of road intersections. These are very good signs of them establishing territories in the area.

Zandspruit plays co-host to Mountain Bike Race




