ZANDSPRUIT NEWSLETTER

Current Project Status

Things are happening in this place! We requested tenders from 3 various Land Surveyors and appointed Andre van der Walt Professional Land Surveyors to do the job. They started in early June with pegging all the stands in the Bush & Aero Estate. They then moved onto the retail and commercial stands, then the Ridge, Manor and Valley. All the pegging was completed on 24 July 2009. The next step is to download all the information and convert this to SG (Surveyor General) diagrams. These are sent through to Polokwane together with the SDP and approval from the SG is expected about 6 weeks later. The Land Surveyors then come back to site and recheck each and every peg again.

The final COE (Conditions of Establishment) are expected very soon and on receipt work will immediately commence on these. These COE's range from the final Service Agreements with the Maruleng Municipality to approved infrastructure designs. The electrical design has been finalised and an interim budget set for the costs thereof. The water reticulation design is also nearing completion as well as the sewerage design for the retail stands. The gate house design has been completed and the electrical fence and monitoring system has been designed specifically for Zandspruit. We are very excited by the final product that will ensure safe and reliable entry and egress from the Estates.

Mike Cowden and his team have been hard at work cutting walkways to all the sites to make it easier for the sales team to find the pegs with potential clients. They have also started clearing the internal perimeter roads of the Bush & Aero Estate and are continuing to stockpile rubble off the farm, which will eventually be used to fill the drainage dip on the airstrip.



Farm Management

Rainfall

As we go into winter, very little rain has been recorded. Only a couple "dust settlers" of a few mm have been recorded.

Vegetation

Even though the vegetation has started to thin out, due to winter approaching, there is still good ground cover in all areas. Food sources for the animals are still in abundance and should be more than adequate for the winter period.

Animals

A decision was made earlier this year to start removing the over populated animals, to reduce the impact they have on the farm during the dry winter season.

During May we captured and culled impala, zebra and wildebeest. This was a great success, with all animals needing to be removed, being captured as planned. During July/August we are planning to remove some nyala.



During the Sustainable Living Festival Cycle Race, a hippo was seen at one of our dams. It was then sighted later at the river crossing to the Island on Zandspruit. We believe it made its way through

the fence during the floods. It stayed with us for a few weeks traveling up and down the river, but later decided to return elsewhere.

A very active hyena lair has been discovered along the river. Looking at the spoor, I can make out that there are several young. Most of the drag marks from kills on the property head for this area. There have been a number of good hyena sightings on the farm.

Both Male & female leopard spoor have been seen on the property this month, but no sighting of them as yet.



<u>Sandspruit River & Dams</u> There are still some very large

pools of water in the Sandspruit River. Very good sightings of Black, Woolly-necked and Saddlebilled storks have been recorded along the river, as well as Giant Kingfishers. A birders' paradise!

stored in specific places for gabion (erosion control) work next
month.
