The **Second Place Exhibition** in Brussels, Belgium will take place on September 24th, 25th and 26th. This will also be the first time we exhibit at this fair.


We are hoping to attract both Belgium and French potential clients, as there is not really a comparable exhibition in France.

Farm Management

Rainfall

A far cry from the rainfall of 2008/2009 with the bush having looked very dry until the last week of January, we have recorded approximately 260 mm from November 2009 through to January 2010.

Vegetation

Due to very little rain early in the season, the grass cover is fairly thin. We are hoping for some good late rains to keep us going through the winter months. The last week of January has seen us have over 100mm.

Animals

The Hippo has paid us a visit again during December. This time it decided to crash through one of our gates on the main road to gain access. It spent two days with us then went back to the Blyde River. Being a female, our thoughts were that it may have been looking for a quite place to give birth.

We have had a very successful birth rate with our impala's this year, with groups of +/-20 babies (nurseries) been seen at a time. A leopard kill was discovered abandoned (Impala carcass) in a tree close to a busy fence line. Male and female leopard spoor have been a fairly common sight on the property during this period.

Hyena spoor are found all over the farm and hyena calls at night are common.

Baby zebra and baby wildebeest have been spotted during December and January, however, there are still no signs of baby giraffe or waterbuck.

Sandspruit River & Dams

The Sandspruit River is still flowing near our eastern fence line ,keeping the river pools below full of clear water. Due to the lack of rain the pools further down the river are starting to dry up. The dams are a bit low for this time of year.

Road & Erosion Control

The Ntundaluka dam spillway has been completed with a gabion structure to prevent any serious erosion.



Matters of Interest

A very large python carcass was found near the Bush Camp (+/- 4 m). There was no clear evidence of how it died. Needless to say the hyena's cleaned up the carcass that night.

The Spotted Eagle Owl nest has been raided by a troop of baboons and the eggs were taken.

In December, the farm and construction staff enjoyed an end of year braai at The Rijshuys.
